

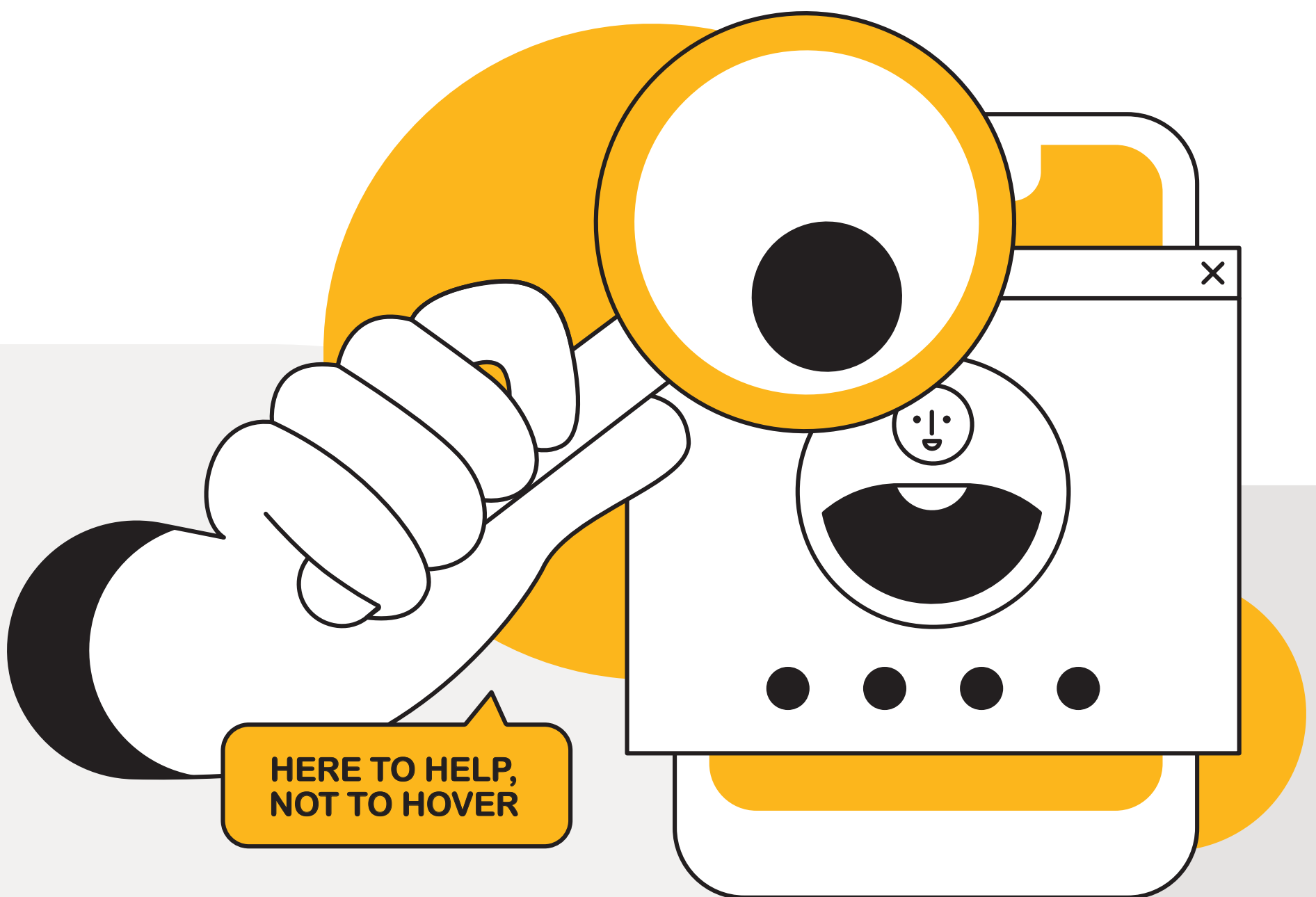
# Your shield against cyber villains.

Posting your location is like sending an open invitation. Keep your info private. Some things are better kept off the internet.



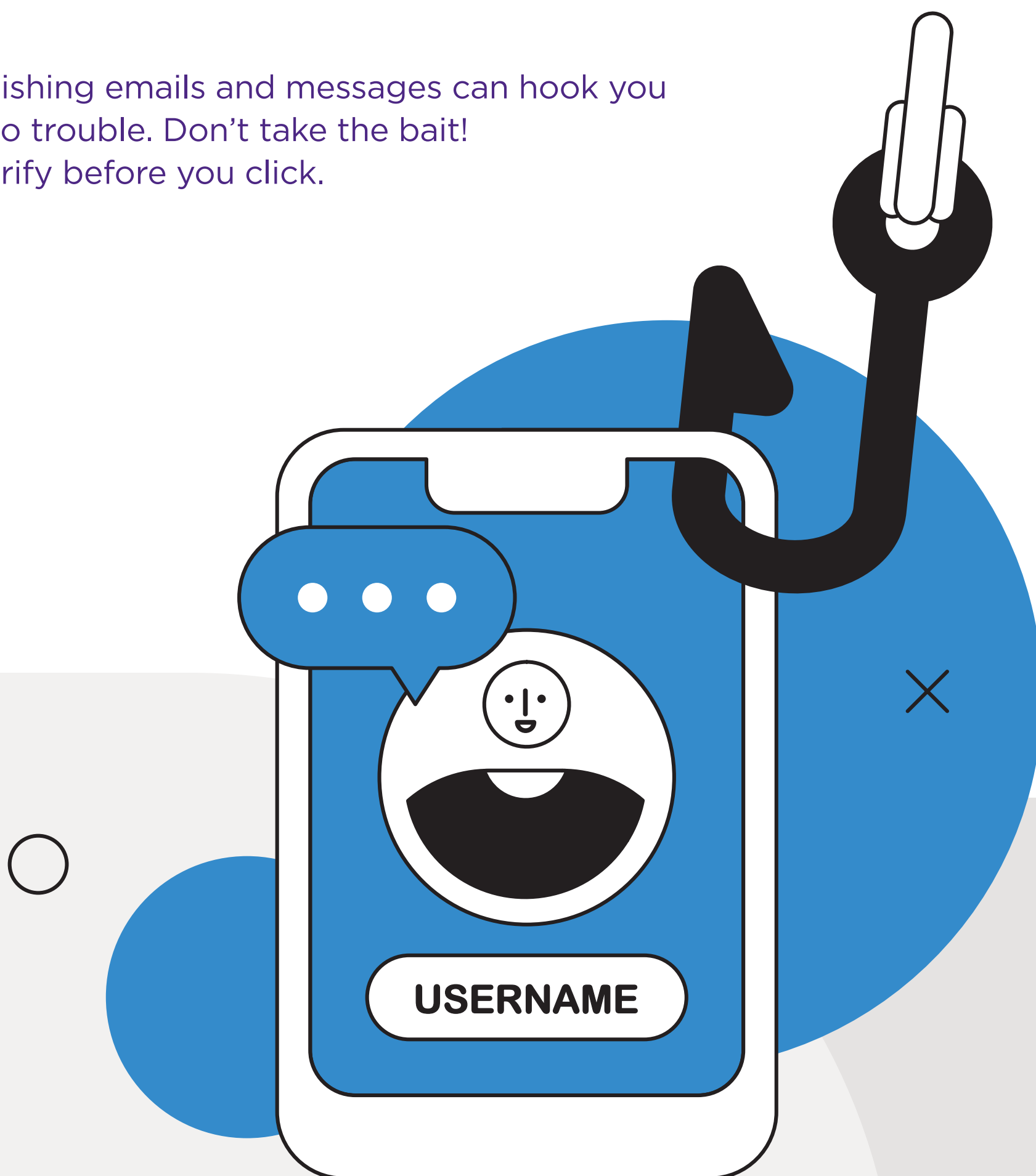
# Update now: Don't let bugs bug you!

The internet doesn't forget. Think twice before posting. What seems fun now might haunt your future.



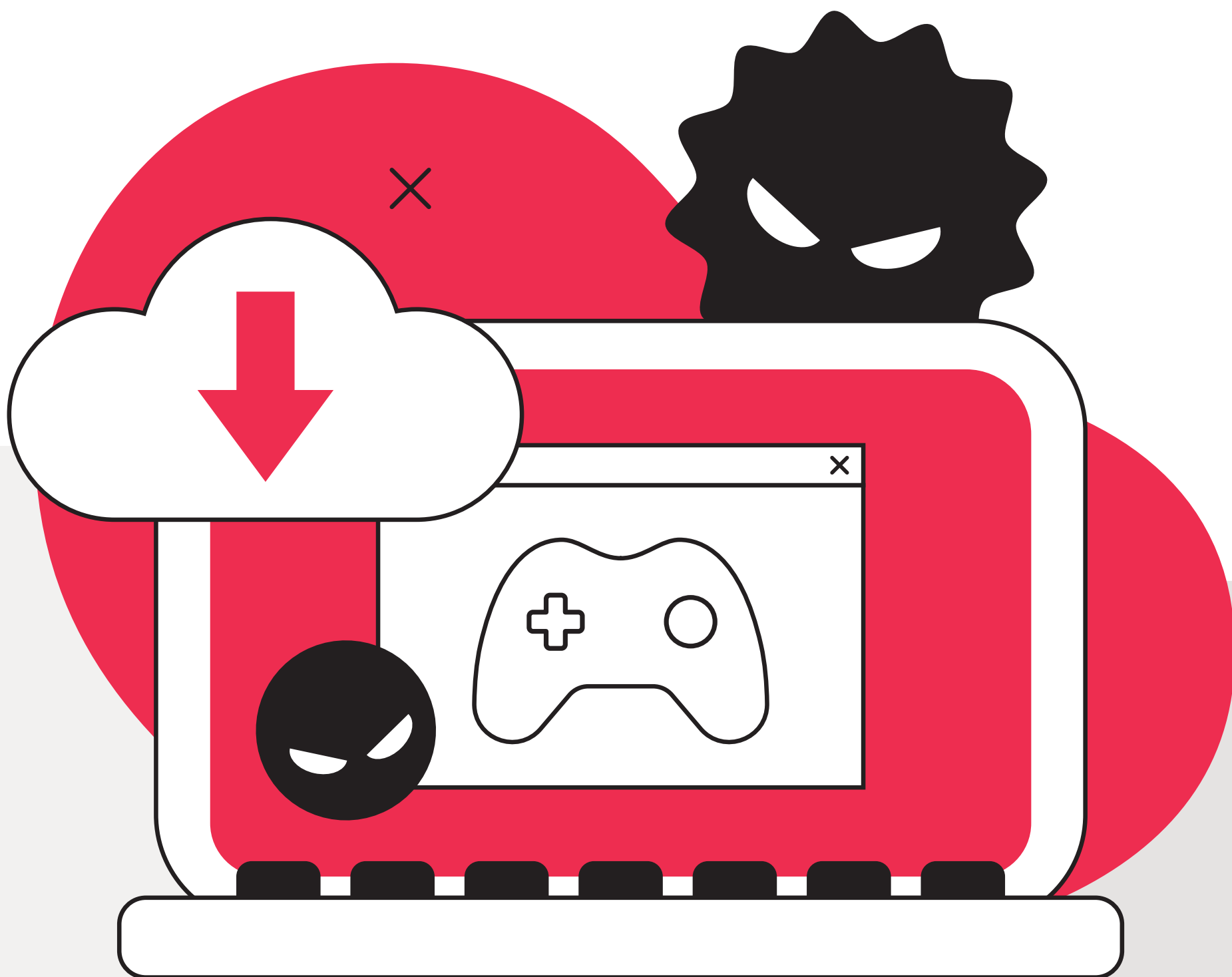
# Your phone is a vault, keep it locked!

Be cautious and install only from trusted sources.



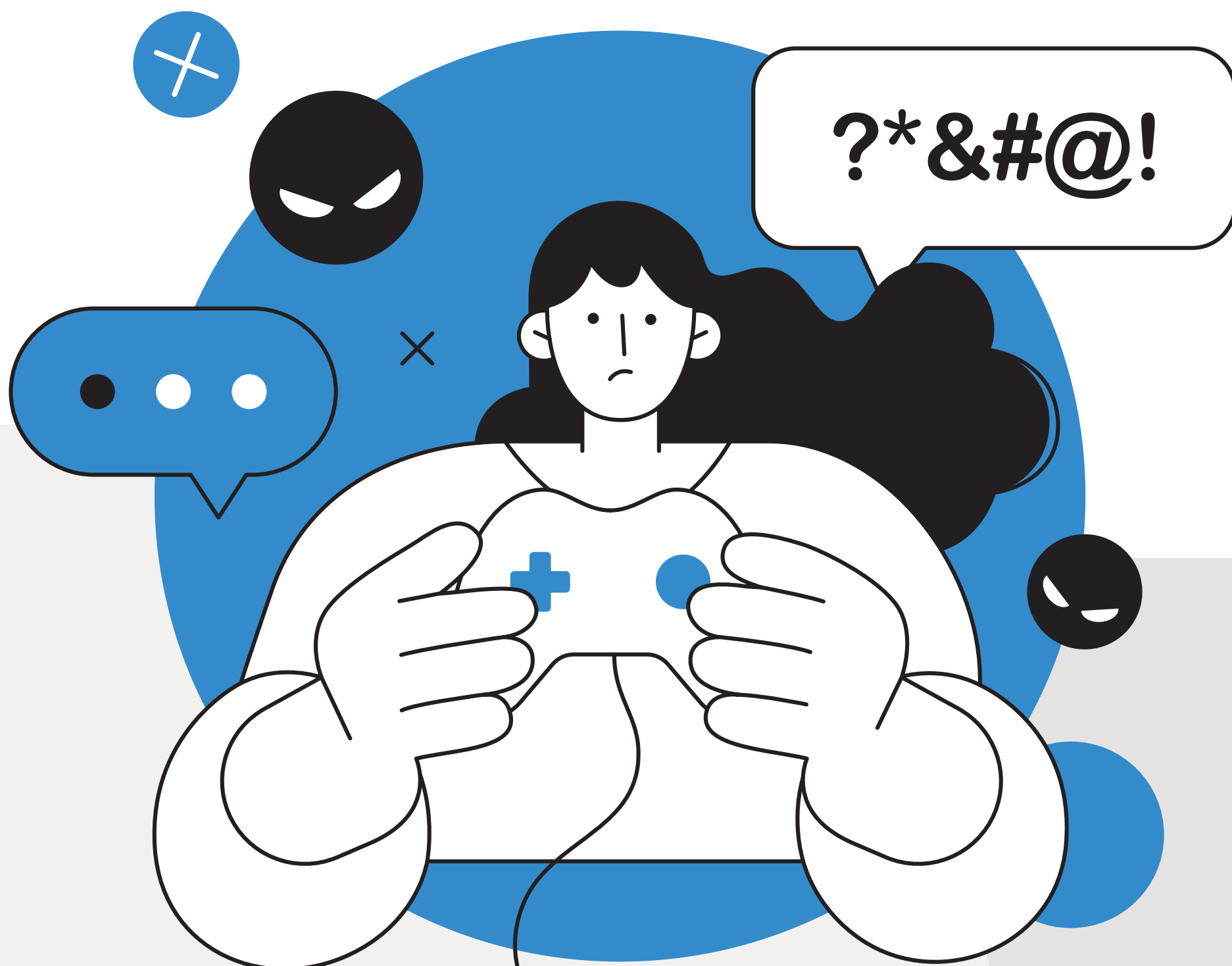
# Parental follow: It's not spying, it's caring.

Following your kids on social media isn't about snooping, it's about ensuring their safety. Let them know you're watching out for them.



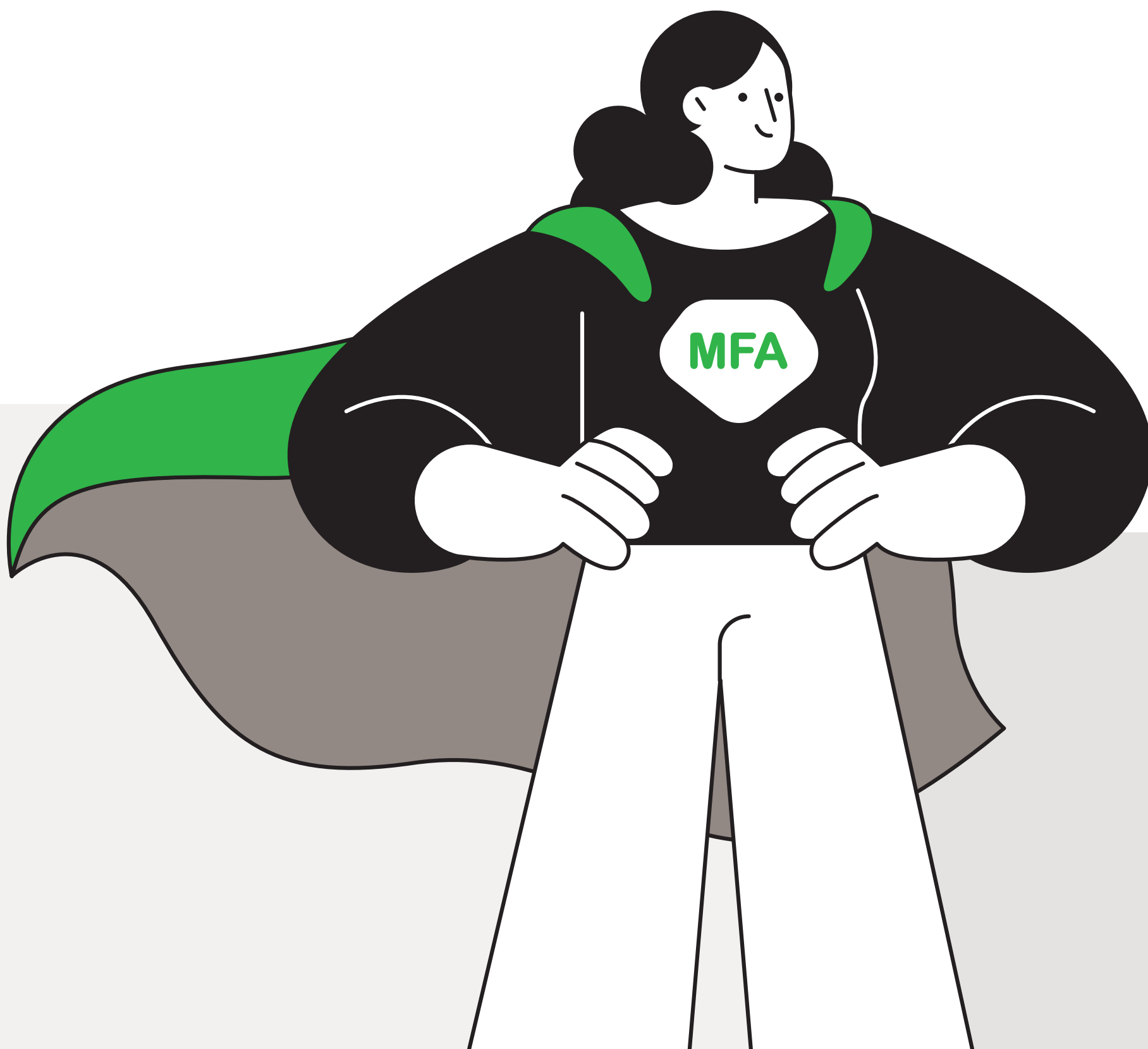
# Is Your Game a Battlefield?

# Share smart: Keep it cool, keep it safe!

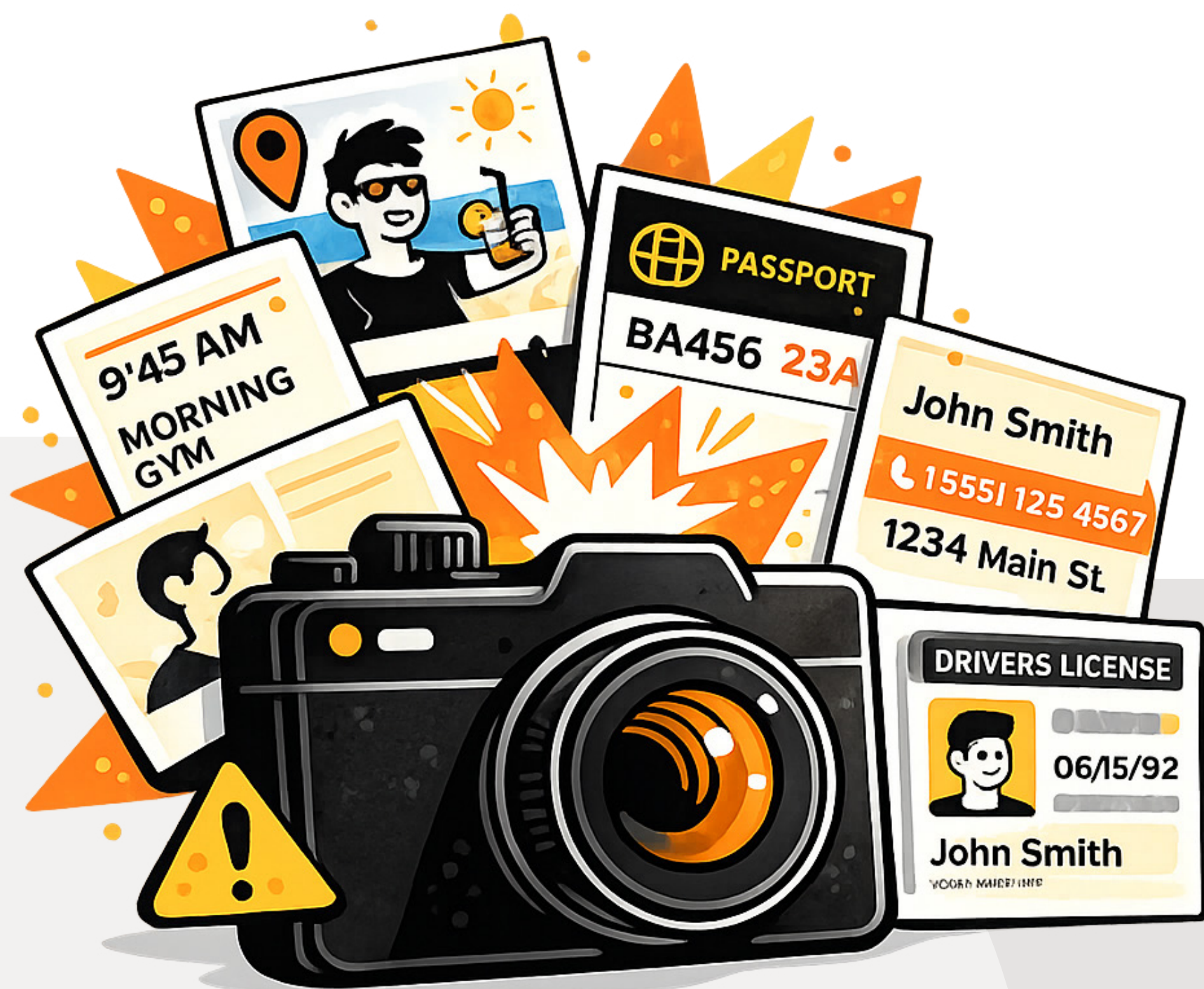
Share your achievements, not your address. Know what's cool to share and what's not!

# Think before you click: Is it too good to be true?

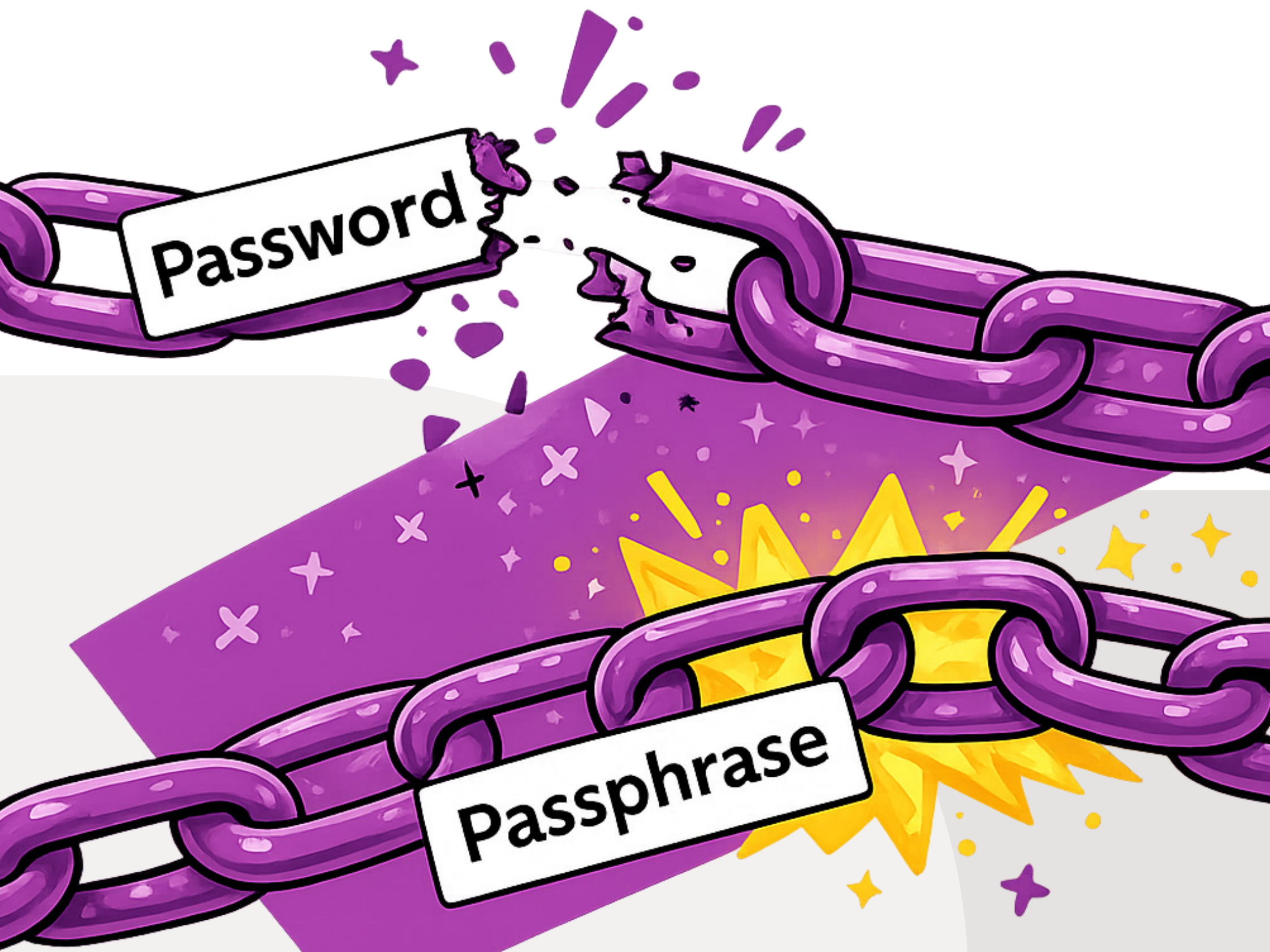
Is it too good to be true? Are they asking for money or photos? Pause, check with an adult, and stay safe!





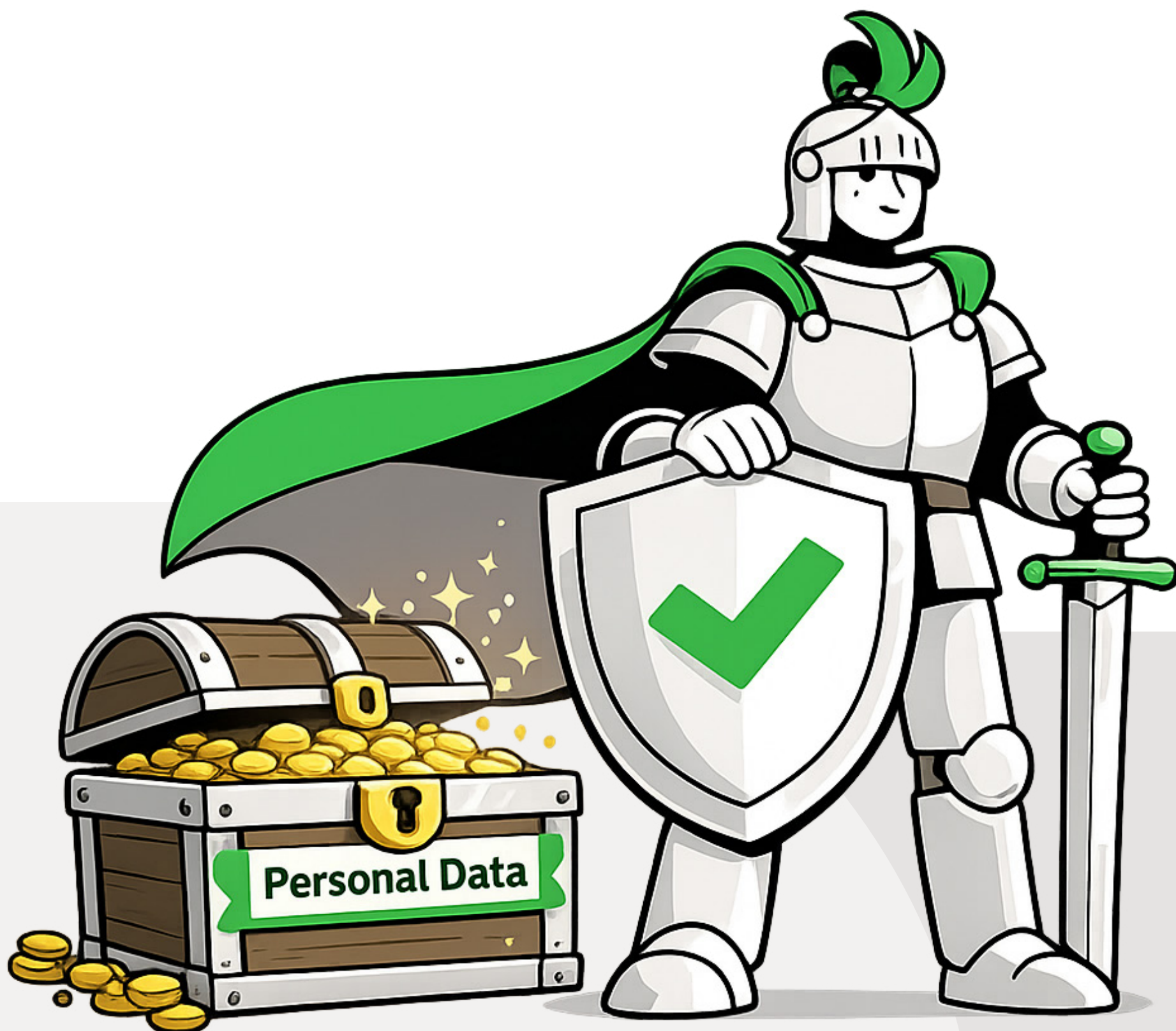
# Passphrases: Stronger than a Password!

Neglecting updates leaves your device vulnerable to malware and other security threats. Update now to protect your bank details, personal information, and important documents.





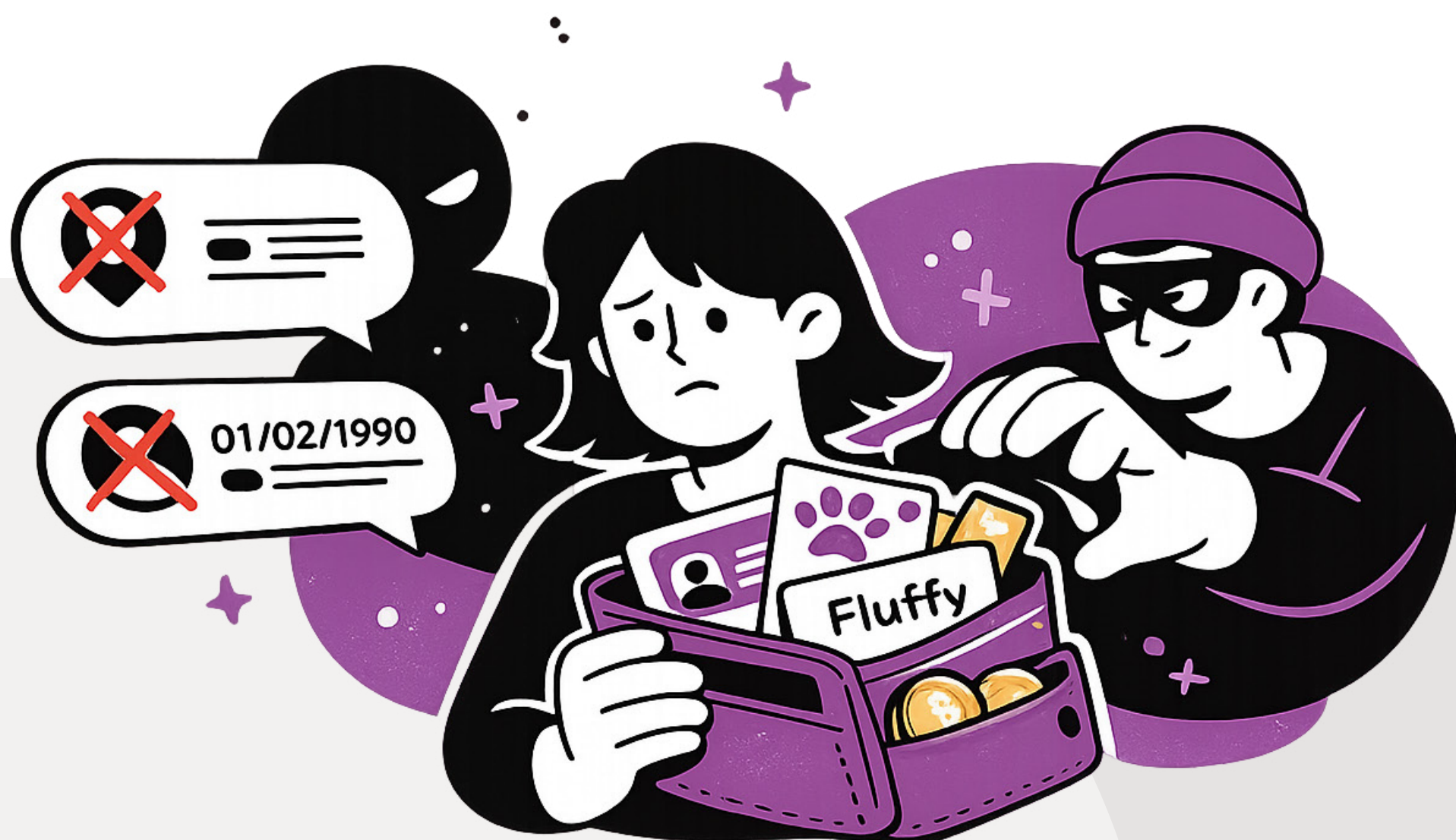
# How to Know If You're Oversharing

Use privacy settings, think before sharing, and disable location sharing to protect your personal information.



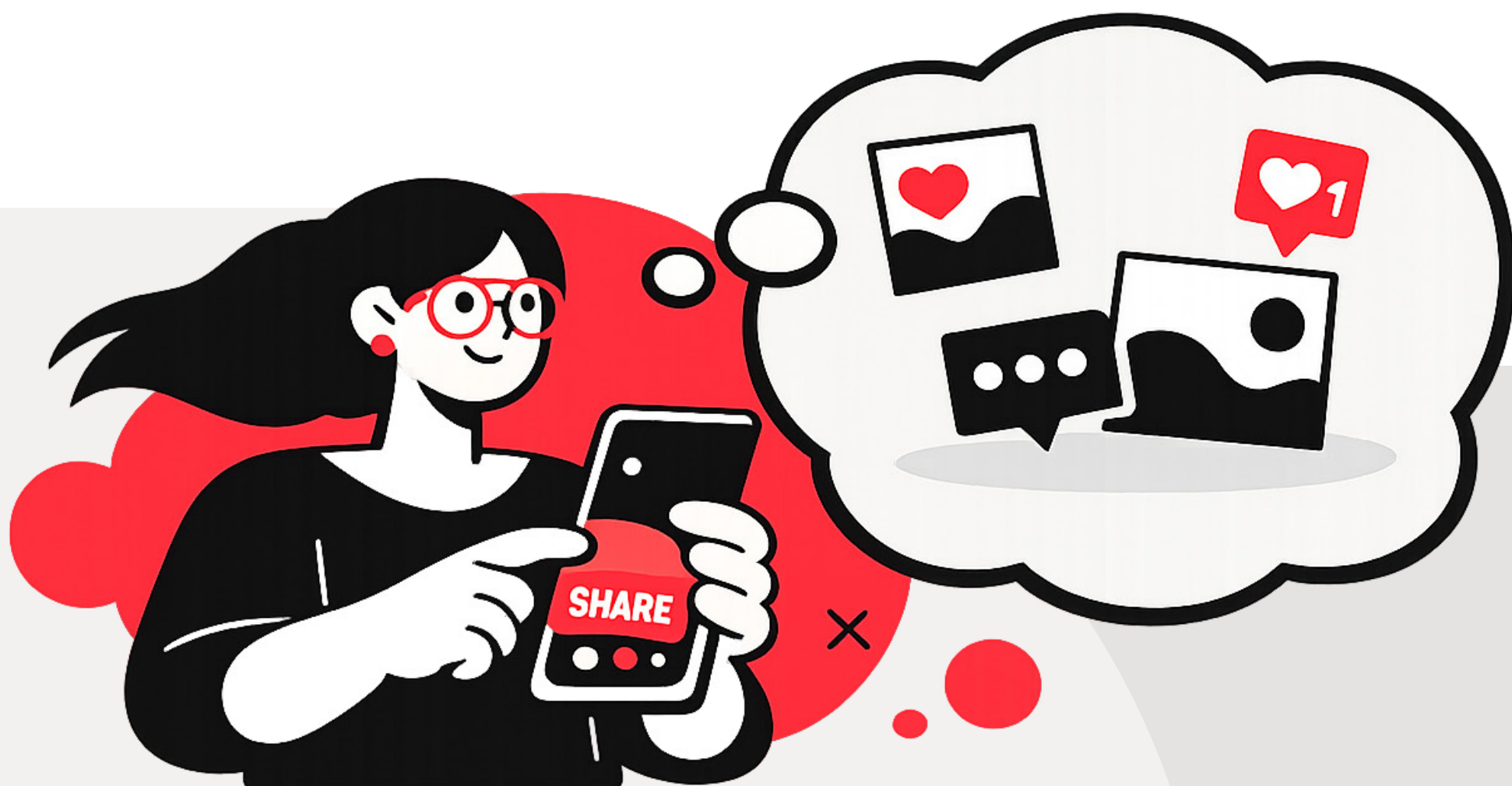
# Treat Your Personal Information like Money
